The Lottery Grants Board may be able to help

The Lottery Grants Board is funded by the New Zealand Lotteries Commission, which raises money for New Zealand communities whilst ensuring that the risks of problem gambling and underage gambling are minimised.



The Lottery Grants Board then distributes these funds to the community through three agencies and its national and regional distribution committees

Where does the money come from?

The New Zealand Lotteries Commission (NZLC) is responsible under the Gambling Act 2003 for promoting and conducting New Zealand lotteries including Lotto, Lotto Powerball, Lotto Strike, Keno and Instant Kiwi.

Over \$100 million each year is raised through the sale of lotteries and is earmarked to be used for community purposes - projects that contribute to the building of strong and sustainable communities.

DISTRIBUTION COMMITTEES

Lottery Environment and Heritage Committee

Te Tahua Taiao me ngā Taonga Tuku Iho

For projects that promote, protect and conserve New Zealand's natural, physical and cultural heritage.

Lottery Marae Heritage and Facilities Committee

Te Tahua Marae Tuku Iho me ngā Whakaurunga

Lottery Marae Heritage and Facilities makes grants for the capital costs of the conservation, restoration and development of marae facilities particularly wharenui, wharekai, and wharepaku facilities.

Lottery Outdoor Safety Committee

Te Tahua Whakaruru-hau

Funds groups whose main purpose is water safety and outdoor safety projects.

Lottery Health Research Committee

Te Tahua Rangahau Hauora

Funds research that promotes the health of New Zealanders

Minister's Discretionary Fund

Te Tahua mā te Minita anō te tohatoha

The Minister makes grants to individuals and groups for projects that fall outside the responsibility of other committees such as; overseas travel that will benefit New Zealand, volunteer fire fighting services, and animal welfare.

Lottery Community Committees

Ngā Tahua Whakatinana Papakāinga

Distributes social-sector grants. One national and 11 regional committees consider applications for developmental or preventative projects, welfare and support services, or projects that help to improve the wellbeing of people in the community.

Pacific Provider Development Subcommittee

Provides grants for the development and strengthening of Pacific Island community groups and providers of social services to Pacific people in New Zealand.

Individuals with Disabilities Subcommittee

Makes grants to people with mobility and communications related disabilities for the purchase and adaptation of vehicles, scooters and other mobility and communication equipment.
